1965 - Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) enacted

2001 - ESEA amended by the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB / AYP)

2015 - Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) signed into law

2017 - ESSA Full Implementation



Title I, Part A Overview

- Largest federal assistance program for schools
- MCS receives Title I funds from the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.
- These funds are based on the Census Poverty Data
- Supplemental funds to enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning
- Provides families with strategies to be involved in the their child's education

Title I Overview

There are two types of Title I programs

Targeted Assisted School (TAS)



Identify students with the greatest academic need based on data



Students receive additional support through pull-out/push in models, after-school programs, or extended learning time School-wide Program (SWP)



All students benefit from funding


